

## ROUTES TO THE UNIVERSITY

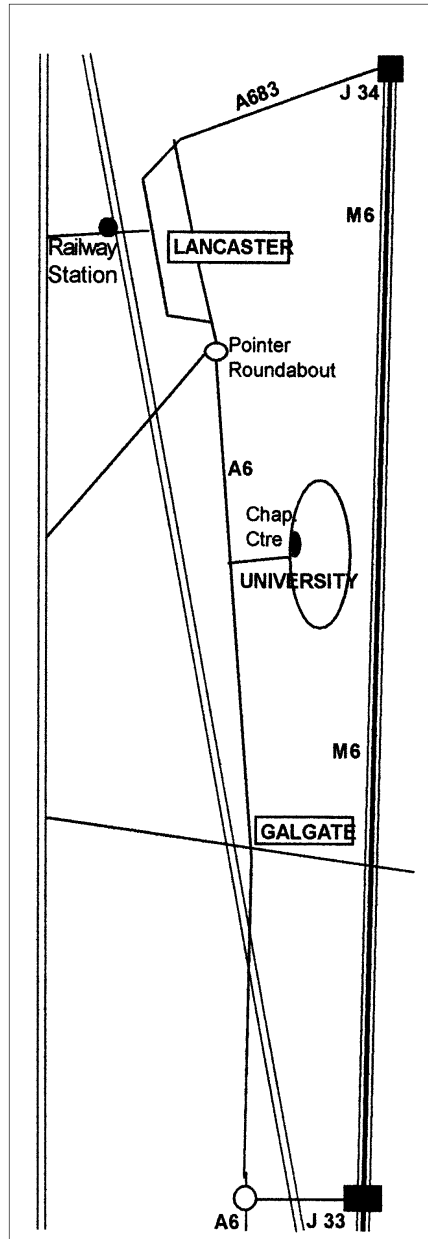
Lancaster University lies about 2.5 miles south of the city of Lancaster. Taxi services are available from both rail and bus stations (**taxi rank tel. 32090**)

### BY BUS

The bus station is situated on **Damside Street** about 5 min walk from the railway station by the castle. The **no. 1** provides a direct link between the city and the university campus and it runs every 15 minutes. The **40, 41** and **x42** also stop at the entrance to the university by the tennis courts, from where there is a 5-minute walk to the Chaplaincy Centre.

### BY ROAD

Leave the **M6** motorway at **junction 33** and take the **A6 north** towards Lancaster. After about 1.5 miles, having passed through **Galgate** village, you will see the University buildings to the right of the road; **turn right** at the traffic lights into the University's main drive. This leads to a **roundabout** at the top of the hill. Take the **first exit** from the roundabout, then the **first avenue on your right** - the Chaplaincy is on the left-hand side.
